The Research Subcommittee has awarded Student Member. Dr Maurice Wu, the first ANZSNR Research Grant.

Congratulations to Dr Wu, from the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, who will receive \$5,000 to assist with the funding of scans for his research on Use of Magnetic Resonance Diffusion Tensor Imaging in the Assessment of Nerve Roots in Cervical Radiculopathy Patients Undergoing Decompressive Surgery (Pilot Study).

The application has been endorsed by the Council and we look forward to welcoming Dr Wu to present his final research project at the 2025 ASM - with the research scheduled to complete in August 2024.

INTERNATIONAL SPEAKERS

Professor Lawrence Ginsberg, USA (Head & Neck Stream)

Lawrence Ginsberg is a Professor of Radiology in the Department of Diagnostic Radiology and Head and Neck Surgery at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Centre, Houston, TX. He is a renowned Head and Neck radiologist and is a past president of the American Society of Head and Neck Neuroradiology.

Dr Mayank Goyal, Canada (Interventional Neuroradiology Stream)

Mayank Goyal is a Professor in the Department of Radiology and Clinical Neurosciences at the University of Calgary. He is also the Director of Imaging and Endovascular treatment at the Calgary Stroke Program. Dr. Goyal is worldrenowned for his ground-breaking work in efficiency and workflow in acute stroke intervention.

Professor Majda Thurnher, Austria (Diagnostic Neuroradiology Stream)

Majda M. Thurnher is a neuro-radiologist at the Medical University of Vienna. She specialises in demyelinating and inflammatory diseases of the central nervous system. She was President of the European Society of Neuroradiology (ESNR) from 2014-2016 and has chaired the European Board of Neuroradiology (EBNR) since 2018.

NSW Council Member, Lavier Gomes, attended the ESNR Council Meeting.

Over 40 societies were represented (mostly from Europe) at this meeting held in Vienna in September. At the meeting attendees discussed the development of a consensus statement to outline what is a reasonable work output for diagnostic neuroradiology. ESNR are going to circulate a survey to collect more data. The ANZSNR supports the development of these consensus statements being developed for global endorsement and use, where appropriate.
